"He enjoyed driving his Camaro and attending our car meets. He was very kind and full of joy when I met him. His hobby of car scenes was only one of many he enjoyed," said Scoggins on the page. "I pray his family finds peace and comfort in this time of sorrow. He will be missed in many ways!"

Tiffany Hyde shared a few links on Facebook to help support Moore's and thanked Shreveport Exotic Car Meets "for dedicating our next meet up June 8 in Cole's honor. He loved the car meets and loved CARS!"

The next Shreveport Exotic Car Meet is June 8 at Starbucks, 4800 Line Ave. in Shreveport.

Mark Zielsdorf is the organizer of a meal train for Lindsey and Scott Moore, Cole's father. Zielsdorf wrote on the page, "Cole was one of the sweetest, most genuine, loving kids you could ever come across. He

was one that kept to himself, but simply because he was too busy appreciating everything around him. He was always happy to be wherever he was at any given moment and touched many lives."

Tracy Bright is the organizer of a meal train for food gift cards for Cole's mother, Jill Moore. "Our dear friend Jill could use our support right now!" she said.

A black-and-white balloon release is being planned at the crash site, but details have not been confirmed.
